THIS LAST YEAR, FRESH START PROVIDED OVER 162 ONE-ON-ONE CAREER COACHING SESSIONS AND A PLETHORA OF CAREER WORKSHOPS SPANNING THE TOPICS OF INTERVIEWING, JOB SEARCHING, AND RESUME WRITING SKILLS. FOR WOMEN SEEKING FURTHER ONE-ON-ONE CAREER SUPPORT, THE MENTORING PROGRAM IS A HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL AND MEANINGFUL PURSUIT. LAST YEAR, THE MENTORING PROGRAM SERVED 89 MENTEES WHO COMPLETED THE PROGRAM WITH A 91% COMPLETION RATE. 96% OF THOSE MENTEES REPORTED AN INCREASED SUPPORT NETWORK AND 92% REPORTED AN INCREASE IN RESILIENCY COPING STRATEGIES.
